Primary Eye Examination Codes	
7	Patient new to the practice or you do not have access to the most recent clinical records (within the primary exam interval)
8	Patient aged 16 since last primary examination.
9	Patient is sight impaired or severely sight impaired
Supplementary Eye Examination Codes	
2.0	Cycloplegic Refraction – for a child requires a cycloplegic refraction following a primary eye examination
2.1	Paediatric Review – to review / follow up a child within 12 months of a primary eye examination
2.2	Follow up/Review /Repeat Procedures – for any repeat or review appointment (not glaucoma) that does not require dilation
2.3	Suspect Glaucoma – for suspect glaucoma review that does not require dilation
2.4	Under 60 Dilation – to be used following a primary eye examination for a patient under 60 that requires dilation.
2.5	Anterior Eye Condition – to be used for a patient with suspect or diagnosed anterior eye disease that does not require dilation.
2.7	Postoperative Cataract Examination – to be used for a post op cataract examination that does not require dilation
2.8	Unscheduled Appointment – for a patient who presents with symptoms within the normal primary exam interval – no dilation.
2.9	Cataract Advice and Counselling – to include providing advice, counselling, prognosis & risk factors for cataract surgery.
3.0	Complex Needs Patients – to provide additional appointment time for patient with complex needs.
Enhanced Supplementary Eye Examination Codes (Dilated)	
4.1	Paediatric review – to review / follow up a child within 12 months of a primary exam that requires dilation or cycloplegia.
4.2	Follow up/Review /Repeat Procedures – for any repeat or review appointment (not glaucoma) that does requires dilation
4.3	Suspect Glaucoma – for suspect glaucoma review that requires dilation
4.5	Anterior Eye Condition – to be used for a patient with suspect or diagnosed anterior eye disease that requires dilation.
4.6	Cycloplegic refraction for child referred by the HES for cyclo refraction of a child under 16 referred by the HES
4.7	Postoperative Cataract Examination – to be used for a post op cataract examination that requires dilation
4.8	Unscheduled Appointment – for a patient who presents with symptoms within the normal primary exam interval – requires dilation
